With the help of our PCSO, Kim Bowyer, Councillor Alun Andrews has re-established the Community Speed Watch programme. This initiative allows both Councillors and local volunteers to monitor and report speeding vehicles in the parish.

Additionally, residents of Brereton Heath Lane have started their own speed monitoring campaign, the Brereton Speed Action Group. We encourage everyone to support these important initiatives to help make our roads safer for all.
